A Ronald McDonald House is far more than a place to sleep. We are a place of comfort, compassion, support and convenience. Many families staying at our House are undergoing one of the most stressful situations they will ever encounter - dealing with the fear and anguish of a critically ill child. They're trying to keep things as normal as possible for their children when in fact their lives are in upheaval. Families travel great distances to our House - often after exhausting every medical resource available near their homes, uprooting their day-to-day lives.

Providing Family Support & Convenience

- We welcome families with a handmade blanket and warm welcome in a safe and secure space
- Our community living environment allows families to connect and support one another
- Warm meals are served to families two nights per week
- Fresh baked cookies, breakfast bags and other foods staples are available
- Family-focused activities, including Paw Pals, Camp Ronald, Visiting Artist & Musicians and outings provide fun and enjoyable distractions for the whole family
- The Mayo Clinic patient shuttle stops at our front door, allowing easy transportation to appointments

The Challenge Today

- The need to serve more families is great and growing in Rochester. Proton beam therapy, regenerative medicine, individualized medicine and science of health care delivery continue to drive the need for our services
- The current House simply does not have the capacity to serve present or future needs of Mayo Clinic patient families
- In 2017, 1,079 families were unable to stay with us because when they called, we had no rooms available
- In the past four years, the Ronald McDonald House of Rochester has turned away more than 4,000 families who needed our services

The Solution

After years of planning we have secured adjacent additional parcels of land along Second Street. This plan allows us to preserve our current home and expand our footprint. This strategic location offers us visibility and is conveniently located between the Mayo Clinic's downtown locations and Saint Marys Campus – just a short walk or shuttle ride away for all guests.

Expand to Meet Demand, Amenities and Features

- House will grow from 42 to 70 guest rooms
- Small indoor gym for active space
- Indoor and outdoor play areas for children and families who need wellness space
- Underground parking for guest families affording easy access out of the brutal winter weather and hot summers for children with compromised immune systems
- Green space for play and recuperation
- The most modern construction available

The Plan

This plan involves a \$16.5 million capital campaign to fund the construction of the expansion.
